Breakfast. Visit to Lourdes, known to be the place where, in a small cave near the Gave de Pau river, Our Lady appeared to a small girl name Bernardette Soubirous. After the Catholic Church approved that the apparitions were real, this town became one of France most famous places. Nowadays, the Our Lady Lourdes Sanctuary is one of the largest pilgrimage centres in the entire world, such as the Our Lady Sanctuary of Fatima. The Our Lady of Lourdes Basilica, which constructions reminds us the biblical sign of the open arms, it's one of the most visited places in Lourdes, worldwide symbol of the love between men, and it's located right above the cave. Free day to personal activities. By night-fall, return to the hotel dinner and accommodation.

13th Day: July 15th – Lourdes / Toulouse / Toronto

Breakfast. Departure to Toulouse, known as “La Ville Rose” – The Pink City, due to its unique architecture in terracotta pink bricks, that combines the charm of an old town with the modern and cosmopolite city. Arrival at the airport, departure formalities and boarding on a flight to Toronto, with a layover in Lisbon.

July 3rd to 15th, 2019

1st Day: July 3rd – Toronto/Lisbon

On time to determine attendance at Toronto airport. Formalities of departure to Paris, on a flight through Lisbon.

2nd Day: July 4th – Lisbon/Paris

Landing formalities at Paris-Orly airport, with assistance and transportation to the hotel. Dinner and accommodation.

3rd Day: July 5th –Paris

Breakfast. Guided tour of Paris, highlighting the Place de la Concorde, the Tuileries Garden, the Champs Elysees, the Arc de Triomphe, the famous Paris Opera, the unforgettable Eiffel Tower and a Seine river cruise. Lunch. Ascent to Montmartre, known as the painters' square, and possibility of riding the funicular. Visit to the Basilica of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, Sacre Coeur. Return to the hotel, dinner and overnight.

4th Day: July 6th – Paris

Breakfast. Guided tour of the Cathedral of Notre Dame, symbol of Paris, one of the oldest Gothic cathedrals in France dedicated to Mary, Mother of Jesus Christ, who witnessed historical events such as the coronation of Napoleon and the canonization of Joana d'Arc. Following is the Chapel of the Miraculous Medal, where in 1830 the Blessed Virgin appeared to Saint Catherine Labouré and gave the world the Miraculous Medal. Lunch. Guided tour of the Louvre Museum, is the largest art museum in the world and a historical monument of Paris. A central landmark of the city, located on the right bank of the Seine with approximately 38,000 objects, from prehistory to the 21st century that are displayed in an area of 72,735 square meters. Return to the hotel, dinner and overnight.

5th Day: July 7th – Paris / Versailles / Rouen

Breakfast. Departure to visit Versailles, an old city and actual suburb in the southeast of Paris, where is located the magnificent palace built in the 17th century to Louis XIV, later known as the “Sun King”. The palace is surrounded by magnificent gardens and suffered renovations after the World War One. Lunch and, in the afternoon, departure to Rouen, a city located in Normandy, known by its old and charming constructions. In here, there will be a visit to the Notre-Dame Rouen Cathedral, with its magnificent gothic front and its two towers, considered to be in 1880 the tallest buildings in the world. Before the day ends, time to visit the Gros-Horloge, a beautiful and big clock from the 14th century that is built in one of the city highest towers, located on the busiest street of the city. This clock tells not only the time, but also the different phases of the moon. On the top of the tower, one can have a magnificent view of the city. Return to the hotel, dinner and accommodation.

6th Day: July 8th – Rouen / Lisieux / Omaha Beach / Mont Saint-Michel

Breakfast. Visit to the place where Joan of Arc was arrested – in a tower of the old castle – and was burned alive. In that place, a church was built in her honor – the Joan of Arc Church. Departure to Lisieux, place where is located the Carmel Chapel, where Saint Theresa is represented, laying in her deathbed, dressed with the habit of The Carmel Order. Lunch and visit to the Saint Theresa Basilica, one of the biggest of the Catholic World and with great artistic value, with special highlight to the beautiful tiles that relate the Love and Mercy of God. The visit continues to Omaha Beach, place where the allied troops arrived, on Jun 6th 1944, best known as the “D Day”, even though it was one of the bloodiest days in the World History. Visit

to the Omaha Beach Memorial, a big sculpture named “Les Braves”, to honor the troops. In the end of the day, departure to Mont Saint-Michel, arrival at the hotel, dinner and accommodation.

7th Day: July 9th – Mont Saint-Michel / Rennes / Nantes

Breakfast. Visit to Mont Saint-Michel, known as the “Wonder of the West”. It’s a magnificent granitic rock of 75 metres high and 850 metres long, that rises between the sands of the Normandy Coast. On the top of the rock there’s a Benedictine Abbey built between the 10th and 13th centuries where, according to the lore, the archangel St. Michael appeared, in the year of 780. The visit continues to Rennes, capital of Britannia, destroyed in the year of 1720 due to a big fire and, when it was rebuilt, a major importance was given to big squares and beautiful houses. Lunch and visit to the Chapel of Saint Yves, with a resplendent gothic style of the 15th century. This chapel was part of the old Saint-Yves hospital, and it was rebuilt in 1998. In the end of the day, departure to Nantes. Arrival at the hotel, dinner and accommodation.

8th Day: July 10th – Nantes / Tours

Breakfast. Nantes city visit, located in the shores of the Loire river, known as the “West Side Venice”. Birth place of Julius Verne, the tour in the city has been made easy by the big green line painted on the floor with about 8 kilometres long, connecting all the main touristic points of the city. In the city centre, there’s the Castle of Nantes, built in the 15th century, and inside there’s the History Museum of Nantes. Lunch and, in the afternoon, departure to Tours, a city located in a triangle of earth, delimited by the rivers Loire and Cher. Although it was severely destroyed during the World War II, it still has historical buildings, like the cathedral, from the 12th and 16th centuries, along with two churches from the same time. Considered by many as the heart of the Garden of France, Tours is a city of Art and History. Arrival at the hotel, dinner and accommodation.

9th Day: July 11th – Tours / Loire Valley / Tours

Breakfast. Departure to the Loire Valley to visit the Chambord and Chenonceau Castles. The Chambord Castle, built in a French Renaissance style, combines the traditional medieval French forms with the classical Italian structures. Built only to be the hunting pavilion to Frances the 1st of France, nowadays it’s one of the main tourist attractions from the country. Lunch and departure to Chenonceau. Visit to the “Ladies Castle”, since it was administrated and protected by women who were important to the French History. Catherine of Medici, the regent queen, chose this castle to be her favorite residence. She ordered the construction of the Grand Gallery, a big saloon over the river, and also the enlargement of the gardens and the palace park. This is the second most visited castle in France, after Versailles. Return to Tours, dinner and accommodation.

10th Day: July 12th – Tours / Cognac / Bordeaux

Breakfast. Departure to Cognac, name given after the famous drink. This is the most appreciated brandy in the world. It’s a city from the 9th century, where the brandy is the star, and where one can find the finest brands, including the Courvoisier (known to be Napoleon’s favorite). Visit to the local Macif winery and to the old city and its medieval streets. Lunch in the city and, in the afternoon, departure to Bordeaux, a city that combines the historical patrimony and the gastronomical culture, based on the precious nectar and the local specialties. It’s a vibrant town, where one can find modern stores, original art galleries and a lot of different attractions. After a brief visit to the city centre, arrival at the hotel, dinner and accommodation.

11th Day: July 13th – Bordeaux / Lourdes

Breakfast. Guided city tour, considered to be part of World Heritage by the UNESCO, with special highlight to the Grand Theatre, the Water Mirror, the Contemporary Art Museum and the City of
